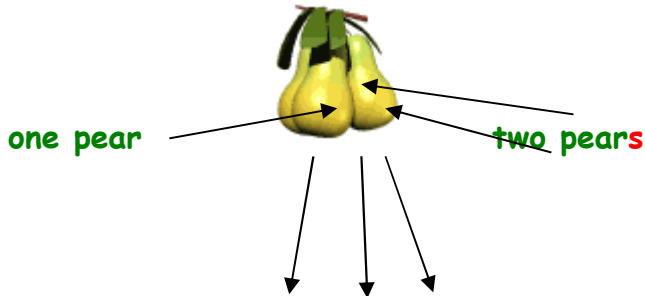


COUNTABLE AND UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS

NOUNS ARE DIVIDED IN : **countable** and **uncountable**.

Countable nouns are things you can count.

For example: **three pears**



Countable Nouns: Can be used in Singular and Plural. For example:

Singular

Plural



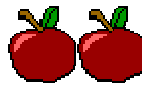
A hat

many/three hats



An apple

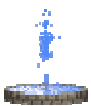
some apples



Uncountable nouns are things you see as a whole, things you cannot count (food and liquids, for example).

Uncountable nouns has only one form.

For example:



water



jelly



chicken

NOTE: money is considered as an uncountable noun.

Example: I don't have money.

Susan has much money.

Other uncountable nouns are:

information, news, furniture,
luggage = baggage ...
